## How to Make an "A" on Your Maps

- 1. Always read and follow map directions:
  - a. For **POLITICAL MAPS**, color countries/states/territories/provinces that border/touch each other in **DIFFERENT** COLORS!  $\rightarrow$  NO light green next to lime green, etc.

b. For PHYSICAL MAPS color:

Water - Blue

Deserts - Yellow w/ Brown dots Land - Green

Plateaus - orange

Mountains - Purple

\*\*\*ONLY **WATER SHOULD BLUE**\*\*\* - oceans, rivers, lakes, seas, bays, etc.

## 2. Label Accurately

- a. Always PRINT neatly
- b. Use a BLACK, FINE POINT PEN for labeling (a thin tip, black Sharpie works well too!)
- c. Check your SPELLING!!!
- d. CAPITALIZE all Proper Nouns
- e. **POLITICAL MAPS** Letter straight across (horizontal) for the names of countries, territories, states, cities, etc.
- f. **PHYSICAL MAPS** Label the direction in which they go for: rivers, mountain ranges, valleys, etc.
  - Only for → Political Maps!!!

## 3. Always include a:

- a. TITLE
- **b. COMPASS ROSE**
- c. **KEY** make a <u>LEGEND</u> BOX that includes all symbols & other necessary information to interpret the map
  - → all symbols should be **INSIDE** the Legend Box!!!
  - i. Use a Star (or circled star) for capital cities
  - ii. Use a Dot for cities
  - iii. Use the symbols in the box for: Rivers, Plateau, Desert, Mountain/Mountain Peak, Mountain Ranges

## 4. Helpful Hints:

- a. LABEL FIRST THEN COLOR!
- **b.** COLOR ONLY IN MAP PENCIL!!! (NO CRAYON, NO MARKERS!!!)
- c. COLOR IN ONE DIRECTION ONLY. DO NOT SCRIBBLE!!!
- **d.** Place several sheets of paper under your map while working.
